

In English, Grade 3 have written some sentences using personification.










SEC AFTER SCHOOL CLUB: Role play

5. Now you will see a student profile for your selected child where you will see all tasks that have been set as homework etc or as individual tasks, and grades/feedback received. This view will also show outstanding and overdue tasks.
