

- Building community: These sessions will help create a sense of unity and shared experience between the two year groups, encouraging stronger friendships and a deeper sense of belonging within the school community.

The student council have been working hard in their meetings the last couple of weeks, to organise our first charity fund-raising event of the year and they have a real treat in store!




The Monster Mash will be split into three different age-groups – EYFS, Grades 1-3 and Grades 3-6.





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Our first whoop Wednesday was absolutely wonderful! Every fortnight Reception and Early Years will get together to have fun and learn together.

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In Geography, Grade 3 created their own bridges like the Millau viaduct. They have used lollipop sticks to do the deck and wool for the metal cables.









Grade 5 have been getting stuck in to some super tricky Maths this week including decimals and multiplying and dividing any number by 4.
