


Each class then called their chosen Student Councilor to the front, where they too were given their badge, ready for their first important meeting on Tuesday, with Mr Hanrahan.

LIBRARY HELPERS



IPADS

Thank you to all Grades 3-6 parents and children who completed their iPad AUP.

As every year, we require the children to provide their own headphones/earphones in Grades 3-6. Unfortunately, Bluetooth headphones are not ideal as sometimes they need special apps/software to make them compatible with the Ipads – which we cannot install. They also rely on being charged regularly. Therefore, we always recommend that children buy headphones/earphones that connect with a 'jack'. Unfortunately, the new iPads no longer have jack sockets, and so a USB C – Jack convertor needs to be used.

These can be bought in many supermarkets and online shops, however we cannot guarantee compatibility with the school iPad and so below is a link to the shop that provides ISB with computing equipment, and that can guarantee compatibility. 5. Now you will see a student profile for your selected child where you will see all tasks that have been set as homework etc or as individual tasks, and grades/feedback received. This view will also show outstanding and overdue tasks.
