To finish off, we started working on our Spring display.





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Work Experience Grade 10

All G10 students are encouraged to participate in 'Work Experience' or here in France you will hear this referred to as 'un stage'. Ideally students should research and approach local employers to find work experience in a field that interests them, and in which they may wish to pursue a future career; in reality it is often the parent's workplace or 'friend of the family' who offer the work placements. Regardless of how the work placement is found it offers a great experience for students to spend time in a work environment and to learn valuable skills.

Work placements should be:

- 1 − 2 weeks in duration
- Organised for a time during school holidays

Students/parents will need to:

- Contact Maria for a 'Convention de Stage' ahead of the work placement
- Email Ms Byrne <u>ann.byrne@isbearn.com</u> after the work experience with details of the dates of the placement and the employers contact details.

Grade 10 is an ideal year for students to undertake work experience and we thoroughly recommend that students take advantage of this being a 'lighter' year before exams take place; however, it is also possible to complete work experience in the higher grades and the same criteria apply as listed above.
